ANNUAL MEMBERSHIP RENEWAL

The remittance envelope for membership renewal is enclosed. **Please return no later than January 31.** After this date, a \$5 late fee charge applies. Membership fee is \$50, plus 40 cents for each registered/identified Holstein ancestry female that has freshened. A state membership allows animals to be registered at the lowest price. For those members with emails, please list your email so we may communicate with you in a more timely fashion, as mail is often unreliable.

Included in the Maryland Holstein Association membership are Farmshine, Southeastern Holstein News, Maryland Annual booklet, newsletters and the All-Maryland calendar. The membership directory is published in the annual booklet, which includes name, address, phone and e-mail address. To be listed as a breeder on the association Web site directory, there is a \$20 fee, payable with membership.

Youth who wish to become members should visit the Holstein USA website at www.holsteinusa.com. Click on juniors, then on the green membership box for information and a form. National junior membership is a one-time fee and includes state junior membership. Juniors can participate in contests and apply for Holstein scholarships.

The Maryland Dairy Convention is set for Friday, Feb. 9, at the Clarion Inn Frederick Event Center (former FSK Holiday Inn), Frederick, themed "Staying Viable in the 21st Century" and featuring John Newton of the American Farm Bureau discussing the current dairy market and Cindy Weimer of the American Dairy Association NE talking on preparing the farm for animal activism. Breakout sessions will focus on farm finances, controlling feed costs and mitigating heat stress. During the day, the Maryland Dairy Industry Association will recognize Dairies of Distinction, and local producers will make up an afternoon on-farm dairy processing panel. 2017 SHOW SEASON

Maryland was the fourth-place state herd in the Holstein show and third-place state herd in the Red and White Holstein show at World Dairy Expo. Maryland placed second in the Holstein state herd contest and first in the Red and White state herd contest at the All-American Dairy Show in Harrisburg, Pa.

At the World Dairy Expo Red and White Holstein Show, Michael Heath and Will and Mark Iager exhibited the junior champion, Greenlea Ad Annie-Red-ET, a winter yearling.

Glamourview exhibited the reserve intermediate champion Holstein, Trulea GW Atwood Candy-ET, the second-place senior 3-year-old, in the All-American Dairy Show. In the Red and White show, Pheasant Echos Turvy-Red-ET, an aged cow, was the senior, grand and best bred and owned champion for Kenny Stambaugh. Chip Savage and Amanda Kennedy won the reserve senior and reserve grand champion honors with MS D Apple Danielle-Red-ET, the second-place aged cow. She was also named best udder in the show. Michael Heath and Madison Fisher took the junior champion title with Entourage-LC Felicia-Red-ET, a fall calf. Greenlea AD Aruba-Red-ET was the reserve junior champion honoree. The spring calf was exhibited by Hill, Keilholtz and Emerson. Jaycey Miller exhibited the best bred and owned junior animal, Pheasant Echos DB Moxie-Red, a summer yearling.
